## Claire's Tips Checked Luggage Never check essential items! This Address book or address list for postcards includes tickets/documents, medication, valuables, keys, and so Battery-operated alarm clock/radio on. Anything you can't live without goes in the carry-on. Cell phone charger When trying to cram as much into Duct tape one bag as you can, keep in mind that you can always do laundry on Electrical converter/adapter the road. Hotels often offer laundry service or you can do a quick hand wash in the sink. Eyeglass repair kit Fold-away rain gear Pack your biggest items first, then medium, and then fill the gaps and extra space with the smaller Inexpensive jewellery items. Luggage strap Wrap up anything semi-fragile in a Mini sewing kit and lint brush thick piece of clothing. Of course if it's actually fragile... kind a better way to transport it! Pen and paper Photocopies of key documents (passports) To prevent *non-valuable* jewellery from tangling, lay it out on a sheet Phrase book of plastic-wrap, then lay another sheet on top. Roll this up and voila- no tangles! Portable smoke detector/carbon monoxide detector (check they're working before you pack them)
